Year 11 Report

Next week you will receive a copy of your child's latest report of the year. The report includes some terminology, explained below.

MEG (Minimum Expected Grade)

Learners in Key Stage 4 have been set target grades to achieve in each subject, known as MEGs (Minimum Expected Grades). A MEG is the 'minimum' expected result if the learner makes the progress we expect them to make. It is not the grade they will achieve with minimum effort.

At the same time, it is not a ceiling whereby their achievement is limited. Should a learner choose to put in extra effort and commitment, they can easily achieve higher than their MEG and will be encouraged to do so by teachers.

April Prediction

This is the anticipated final grade for the learner should they continue with their current attitude and rate of progress. Recent mock exam performance will have been considered by teachers, together with any NEA/coursework completed, in order to decide these grades. With perseverance and a positive attitude we expect all of our learners to achieve their MEG or higher in the summer term.

You will notice that predicted grades at this stage may include a number, explained below:

*A*1, A1, B1, C1, D1 etc. secure in achieving this grade and could achieve the grade above.*

*A*2, A2, B2, C2, D2 etc. should be achieving this grade.*

*A*3, A3, B3, C3, D3 etc. could achieve this grade but are at risk of achieving the grade below.*

I am sure that you will wish to add your own praise and encouragement where your child has been awarded grades meeting or exceeding their MEG.
